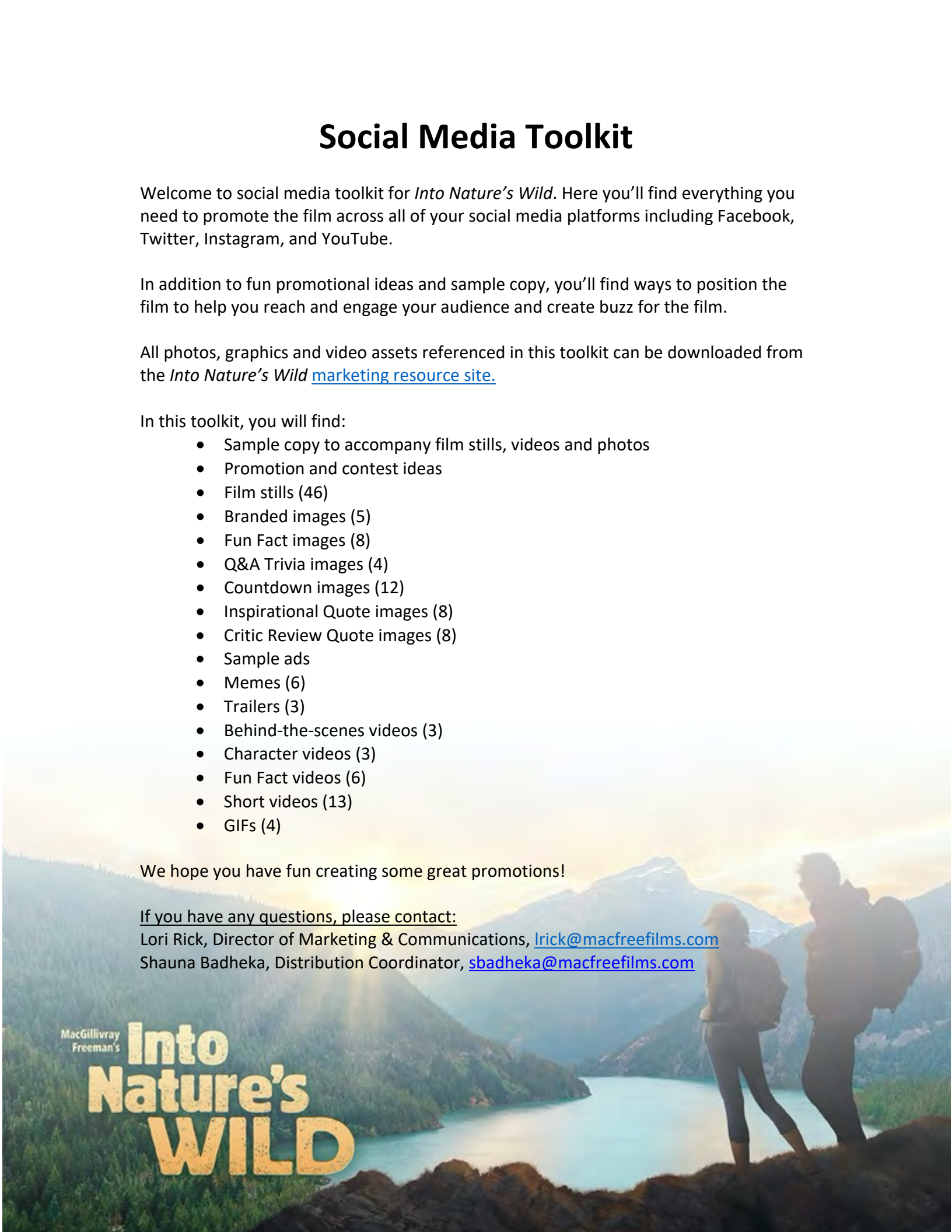

Film Synopsis

From the Academy Award® nominated producers of the acclaimed hit film *National Parks Adventure* comes ***Into Nature's Wild***, a visually stunning cross-country adventure into the hidden wonders of the natural world. Ideas for Social Media Promotions

The following social media promotions are designed to engage your audience in a conversation and generate excitement for the film. The “Go Wild” options are suggestions to take the promotion a step further. Pick a few that you think would excite your online community and have fun!

In addition to creating a dynamic online conversation, promotions can also be used for giveaways (promotional items, tickets, etc.). Be sure to include proper rules and regulations before executing any contests or sweepstakes.

Nature Spotlight of the Week

Each week feature a different location seen in the film and include a fun fact about each spot. A selection of fun facts can be found on page 29. Have your followers guess the location to win swag or tickets to a screening.

- **Sample Post:** #IntoNaturesWild star @JenPharrDavis finds some amazing locations on her hikes in the wild. Can you guess the name of these naturally formed cliffs near Mammoth Lakes? The first person to guess correctly will WIN TWO TICKETS to see #IntoNaturesWild on the giant screen at [theater/museum name]! Good luck!



Go Wild: Can nature be found around your theater or museum? Maybe you have some exhibits that feature cool things from the great outdoors? Take photos of staff interacting with nature/nature exhibits and incorporate it in your film promotion.

Moose On The Loose!

Take photos of the moose plush (offered in the promo package), around your museum or city and run a contest for followers to find the moose on the loose.

- **Example Post:** You’ve heard of elf on the shelf, well now we have a moose on the loose! Our newest film #IntoNaturesWild is full of cute creatures, but one seems to have escaped and is hiding in [theater name]! If you can guess where he is hiding, you’ll be eligible to win tickets to see #IntoNaturesWild on the giant screen!

Go Wild: Extend the moose hunt to the local community or partner locations to help cast a wider audience reach. This is a great way to generate word of mouth buzz and possibly create a partnership of some sort with local businesses!



Photo Caption Contest

What's going on here?! Ask your followers to caption wild or unusual photos from *Into Nature's Wild* with their best descriptions.

- **Sample Post:** "I'm flying, Jack!" Alright, so that infamous line may be from *Titanic*, but we can't help but wonder what's going through this rock climber's mind right now. Caption this photo from our latest giant screen movie, #IntoNaturesWild, and you could win a set of tickets to see it, now playing in [theater name].



Go Wild: Use the promotion to win tickets or swag. The funniest caption, or caption with the most likes, wins a pair of tickets to the film.

Where Is Your Wild?

How do you get "wild" in nature? Ask followers to tag your theater/museum in their outdoor photos, showcasing adventure and exploration. These photos could be printed and posted in a special display at your theater/museum or you can choose to show them on the big screen before the film starts! Make sure to let participants know you'll be showing their picture on the big screen.

Go Wild: Every Wednesday post a #WildWednesday IG story showcasing the previous week's photo submissions and ask viewers to share how they plan on getting wild out in nature. Tease the film and tag any type of giveaways you give out to followers whose photos have been specially selected.

Host a Twitter Party

Give your audiences a chance to ask the filmmakers how they got the shot, or what inspired John Herrington to go to space, by inviting film talent or local experts to host a twitter party on a set date and time. Followers can tune in to join a conversation about the film and get stoked to see it themselves.

Instagram Live

Create a live event and share the moment with your online followers. If you are hosting film talent, local nature experts or have any thematic programming related to the film, tease out the special event to your followers so they can join the conversation. Share behind the scenes moments, host a Q&A and give your online followers a bit of FOMO and encourage them to join in for future events.



Nature Access for All

Most families live in cities. This film encourages a connection to nature for all people, regardless of their location, background, abilities or socio-economic level. Use the film as an opportunity to reach underrepresented groups and celebrate the many ways that all cultures connect with nature.

Celebrate Traditional Environmental Knowledge

The Native Americans featured in the film, including Ariel Tweto, John Herrington and Shaun Martin share their traditional connections with nature. Reach out to local indigenous groups to share their stories, traditions and nature connections with your online audience. Share resources to learn more and get involved in local events.



Reach out to Underrepresented Groups

Singer and speaker Emma Faye Rudkin is a role model and advocate for the deaf and hard of hearing community. The film highlights how people with disabilities, particularly children that are deaf, experience nature from a range of perspectives. Arizona's Antelope Canyon is a slot canyon formed by thousands of years of flash floods, giving the narrow canyon its stunning wave-like formations.



Formed by a volcanic explosion, and filled only by rainfall and snowmelt, Oregon's Crater Lake reaches 2,000 ft deep and is the deepest lake in the U.S.!



Utah is home to more than 2,000 natural arches, including some of the largest and most iconic arches in the world!



Grebes move their feet 20 times per second, making them the largest animal to walk on water!



The Lewis and Clark Expedition traveled 8,000 miles and identified 178 plants and 122 animal species previously unknown to European settlers.



The wingspan of the Eagle Owl stretches an average of 60 to 72 inches. That's 3 times longer than its height!



Only male moose grow antlers, which can span up to 5 feet and weigh over 65 lbs!



Utah's Pando Aspen Grove is a colony of 47,000 genetically identical aspens all growing from one root system. It's the largest single organism on Earth!

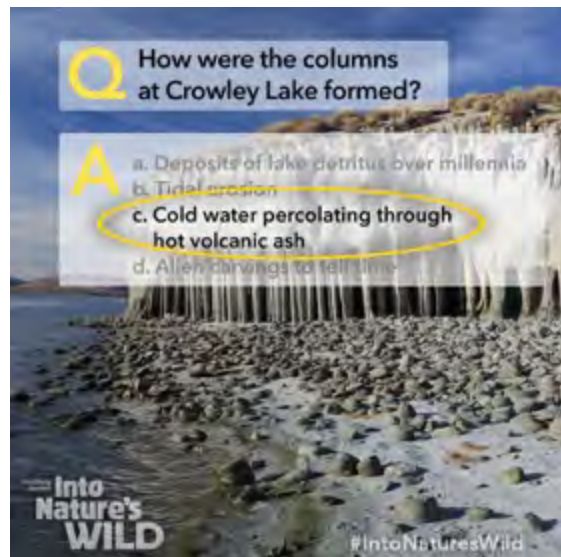
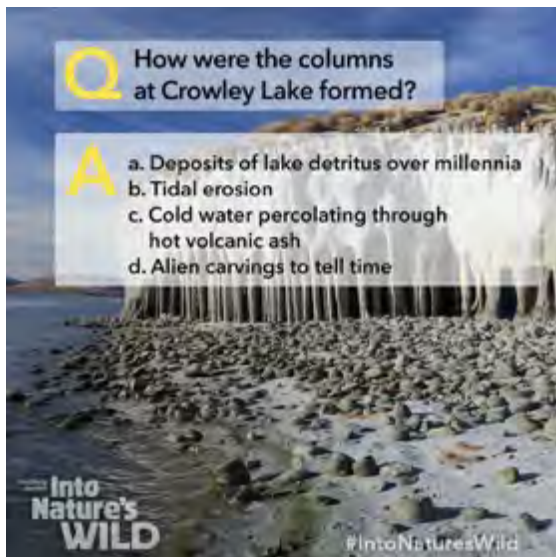

- Spending time in nature, even in a city park, is one of the fastest ways to help lower stress, blood pressure and heart rate.
- Getting 5 to 15 minutes of sunlight two to three times per week gives your body vitamin-D boosting benefits! Vitamin D helps fight disease, depression and has been shown to aid in healthy weight loss.
- Utah's Pando Aspen Grove, also known as the Trembling Giant, is a clonal tree colony that is actually a single organism, all sharing the same root system. At 6 million kgs It is the world's largest living organism! At approximately 80,000 years old, it is also among the oldest living organisms on the planet.
- Crater Lake is the deepest lake in the U.S. at nearly 2,000 feet deep. If you placed the Eiffel Tower at Crater Lake's deepest part, there would still be nearly 1,000 feet of water above it!
- The Albuquerque International Balloon Festival was first started in 1972 with only 13 balloons participating. It now includes over 600 balloons!
- The Appalachian Trail crosses 14 states and is nearly 2,200 miles in length and takes the average hiker 165 days to complete. Only 1 in every 4 people who attempt to complete the full Appalachian Trail succeed in doing so.
- Western Grebes are the largest animal able to walk on water. They move their feet 20 times per second and can sprint 20 meters on the water surface.
- Niagara Falls is considered the 8th wonder of the natural world. It consists of three separate falls, and 700,000 gallons of water travel down the falls every second.
- The ancient structures at Mesa Verde include 4,000 archaeological sites and over 600 cliff dwellings. They were built between approximately 600 to 1300 AD by the Anasazi people and still stand today!
- The Lewis and Clark Expedition traveled 8,000 miles in 2 years and identified 178 plant and 122 animal species previously unknown to European Settles. It is considered one of the most important scientific expeditions in American history.

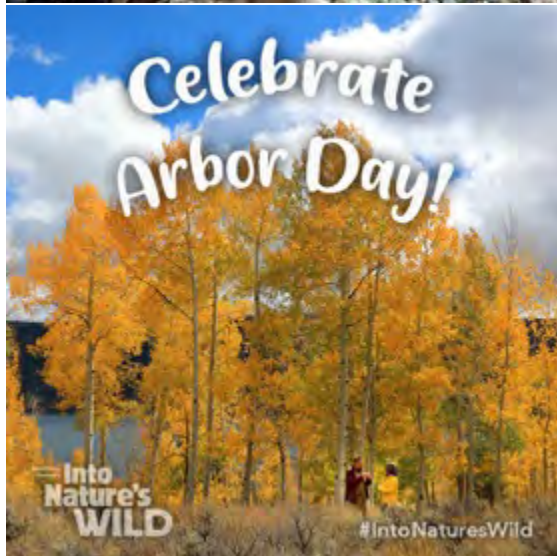

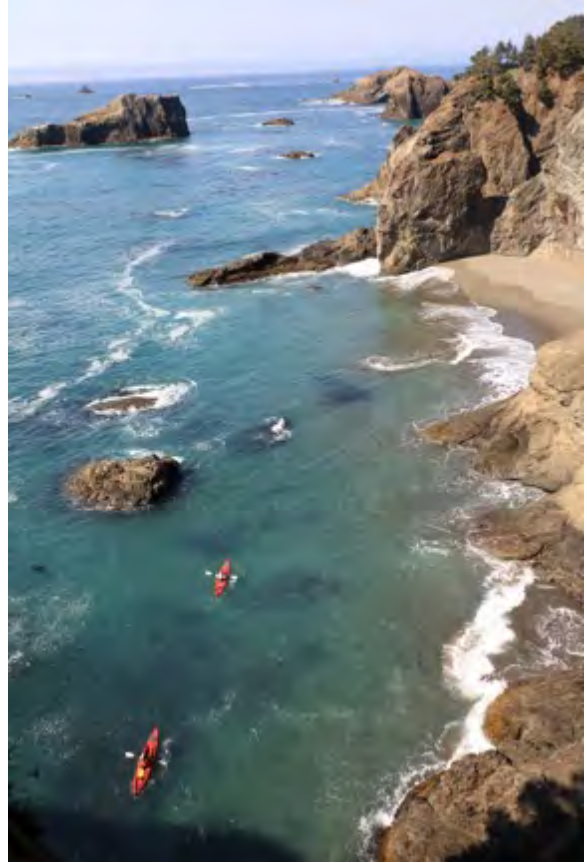

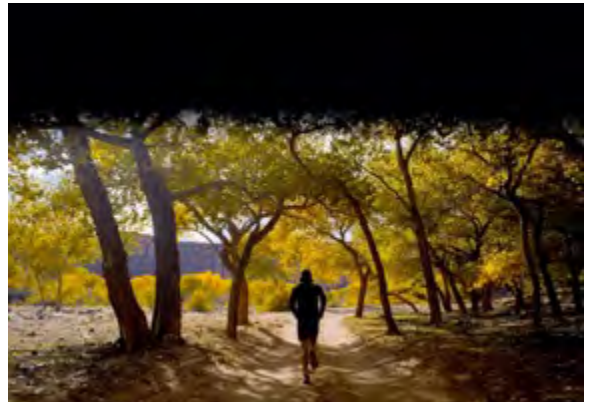

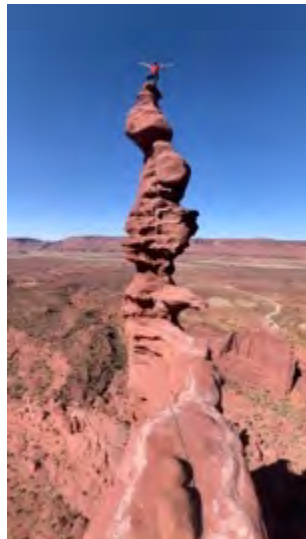
